

QUAIL CREEK COUNTRY CLUB PROPERTY OWNERS ASSOCIATION COVID-19 REOPENING PLAN

On April 1, 2020 the Quail Creek Country Club Property Owners Association implemented closures of the Association facilities required by the Executive Orders of the State Arizona Governor Doug Ducey. The Executive Order 2020-18, Stay Home, Stay Health, Stay Connected, was a declaration due to the necessity to prepare for, prevent, respond to, and mitigate the spread of COVID-19. The Executive Order 2020-18 was to be in effect until April 30, 2020. On April 29, 2020, the Arizona State Governor extended the Executive Order to May 15, 2020 with fewer limitations to certain activities.

The latest Executive Order promotes engaging in outdoor exercise activities, but only if appropriate physical distancing practices are used to maintain physical distancing of at least six feet from any other person, consistent with guidance from CDC.

The Quail Creek Board and Management Staff have created the following strategic plan and guidelines to reopen the dog park, bocce ball, tennis, and pickleball courts. We requested assistance from Association clubs in drafting our strategic plan and guidelines.

We ask that the residents follow these guidelines to protect themselves and others from the possible spread of COVID-19. Failure to comply with these guidelines could result in closure of the facility, fines and penalties (re: fines and penalties see Quail Creek Rules 1.8).

The Association cannot stop the spread of the virus, only you can, by following the CDC guidelines as well as Association guidelines. Please enjoy the amenities, but do so at your own risk.

Do not use the Association facilities if you:

- are not feeling well
- have been in contact with someone with COVID-19 in the last 14 days
- are a vulnerable individual with serious underlying health conditions

If you decide to play:

- wash your hands with soap and water; bring personal hand sanitizer
- maintain your distance from other players by 6 feet or more
- bring personal hydration drinks (water fountains are not available)
- gloves are recommended
- do not share game equipment; clean equipment after each use
- do not share sunscreen or lotions
- do not share personal chairs
- do not shake hands, high five, or hug (no physical contact)
- do not touch your face during play (with or without gloves)
- have fun and be safe

Until further notice, only Quail Creek residents are allowed to use the facilities. No other guests are permitted. Please read the facility guidelines that pertain to the area of use (i.e. tennis, pickleball, bocce ball, etc.) regarding reservations and limited hours. Remember that others may have reservations, so please be courteous by leaving the courts promptly. Restrooms are temporarily closed. Tables and benches have been removed or blocked off. Please bring a personal chair. Water fountains and ice machines have been turned off. At this time, spectators are not permitted.

RULES FOR TENNIS

Until further notice:

1. No Round Robins are allowed.
2. All players must stay on their reserved court.
3. There will be no Club-sponsored events of any type:
 - a. Open Play Round Robins
 - b. Socials
 - c. Skill-Level Round Robins
 - d. Organized Play
 - e. Lessons
 - f. Clinics
 - g. Community Play
4. Tennis balls are to be provided by players, and each ball must have the owner's name or identifying mark. The Association or Club will not provide any tennis balls. It is highly recommended that tennis balls be properly sanitized before each reservation.
5. Players are encouraged to bring their own hand/ball sanitizer.
6. Balls straying onto other reserved courts should not be picked up or handled by anyone other than the players on the originating court.
7. Players should place their personal items (backpacks, water bottles, etc.) at a safe distance (6+ ft.) from other player's items to avoid player congregation and surface contact.
8. There should be no handshakes or physical contact between players.
